PRESIDENT ZELAYA KEEPS POSITIVE BALANCE

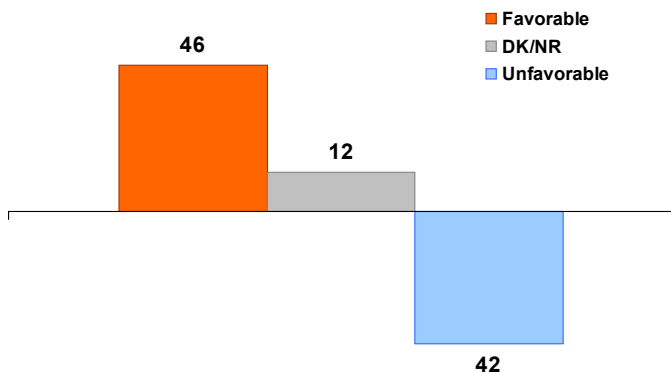
In spite of the economic problems that affect the quality of life of Hondurans day by day, Manuel Zelaya as an individual manages to keep a positive balance of opinion, according the latest Independent Public Opinion Poll done by CID/Gallup.

In terms of his work as president there is a schism among the respondents in terms of his image as Manuel “Mel” Zelaya, with some saying that he is doing a good or very good job, and the same amount saying that he is doing a bad or very bad job.

It was also evident that the higher the respondent’s education, the more favorable his/her opinion toward the president.

HIGH COST OF LIVING: THE STONE INSIDE THE SHOE

The high living cost is the main problem that Honduran families face. This problem grows worse in faraway areas where complaints of not being able to afford basic living expenses are more frequent.

Similarly, the higher the respondent’s educational level, the more likely the high cost of living will be singled out as the main family concern.

Although this is the main concern for the respondents and their families, it is crime and violence which are the most important national problems.
